## Important Notice

### Canadian Niagara Power Inc. planned Power Outage

Dear Valued Customer;

Canadian Niagara Power Inc. ("CNPI"), wishes to inform customers that we will be assisting a private contractor relocate an oversized vessel in our Port Colborne service territory. This relocation is scheduled to take place on **Saturday December 16, 2017 at 8:00 A.M.** In order to carry out this work in a safe and controlled manner the planned power outage on this date will last for approximately four (4) hours. Should the relocation take longer, CNPI will communicate this via Twitter updates – <http://twitter.com/CNPower> .

CNPI recognizes that this may be an inconvenience to our customers and have therefore chosen to interrupt power on the smallest scale possible as the vessel moves geographically from one location to another. It is CNPI's strategy to mitigate the length of the outage by attempting to restore sections of power as the vessel moves along its path (Invertose Dr. to Elm St. to Sherwood Forest Lane (Omar Ave) to the Welland Canal). Approximately 220 customers will be affected by the outage and have been contacted via direct telephone call or an automated call blast.

Please note; there is no alternate date for this outage, barring any unforeseen circumstances the intention is to co-operate with the private contractor and other controlling authorities involved in this undertaking to ensure the safe movement of the vessel.
